On Friday, the 26th, the InnerChange Student Ministry is planning to have a Lock-In at First E. Free, and it looks like it's going to be a great time of exhausting fun and excitement. This is an 11 hour party with a purpose, and we hope that many of our students and their friends will be able to be involved with it.

Some details:

- While not required for attending, if students know of friends they will be bringing, we ask that they try to let us know ahead of time.
- InnerChangers should use the enclosed cards as personal invitations!
- Our strongest consequence for blatant rule-breaking will be calling parents to come get their student at whatever time necessary. So we encourage you to express to your student your desire for a full night of sleep. ☺
